The Red Armillary Sash

The Red Armillary Sash (One Brush) represents a dynamic subject full of tension: ocean, sky, typhoon, with so much going on. This is such an auspicious brush stroke — I think it contains a lot. This is an unprecedented expression in Chinese ink. We could say this is an propitious brush stroke — it is power, energy, and the chaos that creates the universe: the big bang. I practiced for quite some time to be able to master such a large brush. I practiced on more than ten pieces of paper, and now I'm able to use one brush stroke to represent this great tension on such a large surface.

The red armillary sash is one of the divine weapons used by Nezha, a protection deity in Chinese mythology. Given by the Great Monad when he takes Nezha as a disciple, the silk-like divine weapon was likely made during the creation of the cosmos. It is powerful enough to cause massive turbulence when brandished.
